Today, as a Palestinian American, Rima leads a diverse team whose cultural perspectives and expertise inform every project, resulting in interiors that reflect the lives and identities of the people who inhabit them.

"Design should be joyful, inclusive, and deeply personal," says Rima. "Our goal is to create spaces that support wellness and express who you are in a way that feels authentic and lasting."

Based in Raleigh, TEW Design Studio brings this philosophy to life in fresh, timeless

interior spaces that enhance daily life and promote wellness, with every element curated to reflect the client's story and vision for their home and business.

"Great design isn't about mimicking trends—it's about expressing identity through space," explains Rima. "We love creating those moments with contrasts and layers; where color, texture, and artistry come together to create welcoming moments that still feel grounded."

Central to this philosophy is TEW's collaborative approach: listening deeply to understand each client's rhythms, values, and challenges; drawing on the team's diverse cultural and creative roots to enrich every project; applying science-backed design principles that prioritize mental health, comfort, and joy; and fostering a transparent process that remains inspiring from the first sketch to the final installation.
